OVERVIEW

Acres for America, one of the most effective public-private partnerships in the history of U.S. conservation efforts, announced \$3.2 million in grants to protect and connect wildlife habitat across more than 84,350 acres in Alaska, Arkansas, California, Georgia, Montana, South Carolina, Texas and Vermont. These eight grants will leverage an additional \$70.8 million in matching contributions, pushing the total conservation impact for the 2018 grant slate to more than \$74 million.

Acres for America is NFWF's premier land conservation program. Since 2005, NFWF and Walmart have supported the conservation of critical habitats for birds, fish, plants and wildlife; connected existing protected lands to unify wild places and protected migration routes; provided access for people to enjoy the outdoors; and helped to ensure the future of local economies that depend on forestry, ranching and recreation.

Since its inception, Acres for America has funded 88 projects in 38 states, the District of Columbia and Puerto Rico to permanently protect more than 1.4 million acres — far surpassing its original goal of 100,000 acres — and connecting over 10 million acres.

Creamer's Field Migratory Waterfowl Refuge Expansion (AK)

Brushy Mountain Conservation Easement along the Coast Ranges of California

Grantee: Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation

Grant Award:\$500,000
Matching Funds:
Total Amount:\$32,275,000
Permanently protect 26,144 acres of private forestland
and rangeland along the Coast Ranges of California. Project
will conserve high-quality critical habitat for salmon and
steelhead trout, tule elk and numerous other sensitive
species; expand a 49-mile long corridor of protected lands;

and enhance public access to the Eel River. Project will also help to maintain a family-owned, sustainably-managed forest and a local timber industry reliant on private forestlands.

Conservation of Kootenai Forestlands in the Cabinet-Yaak Linkage Area of Montana

Grantee: The Trust for Public Land
Grant Award:\$400,000
Matching Funds: \$8,000,000
Total Amount:\$8,400,000
Purchase a conservation easement with the Stimson Lumber
Company on the 22,275-acre Kootenai Forestlands property.
Project will protect a critical watershed and forestland
habitats in the Cabinet-Yaak Linkage Area, a key connection
for grizzly bear, lynx and bull trout. Project will prevent
subdivision and development; ensure public access and
protect a major drinking water reservoir.

Protection of Sabine Ranch for Incoporation into the McFaddin National Wildlife Refuge (TX)

Acquire 12,376 acres of Texas coastal prai	rie and marsh

habitats within the McFaddin National Wildlife Refuge boundary. Project will protect water quality, shallow aquatic habitats, and emergent marshes that are essential for shorebirds, and other migratory waterfowl.

Acquisition of Rockhouse Creek for the Enhancement of the Kings River in the Ozark Highlands (AR)

Grantee: The Nature Conservancy

Grant Award:\$370,000
Matching Funds:
Total Amount:\$1,360,000
Acquire the 550-acre Rockhouse Creek tract, connecting
more than 20,000 acres of previously protected and
publicly accessible land along the King's River in the Ozark
Highlands. Project will secure habitat for 18 Ozark endemic
species, expand opportunities for public recreation and
support a planned stream restoration project.

Protection of Groton Plantation

in the Savannan Kiver water sheu (SC)
Grantee: The Nature Conservancy
Grant Award:\$500,000
Matching Funds: \$10,445,000
Total Amount:\$10,945,000
Purchase a conservation easement on Groton Planation,
protecting 13,681 acres of high priority longleaf pine forest
in South Carolina. Project will connect 125,000 acres of
public and private protected lands in South Carolina and
Georgia; create a 50-mile wildlife corridor; and provide
habitat for rare plant and animal species including the
endangered red-cockaded woodpecker and gopher tortoise.
The project will also protect a major drinking water source
for Savannah, Georgia and secure forestry-related jobs in the
local rural economy.

Rolston Rest Acquisition within Vermont's Green Mountain National Forest

Grantee: The Trust for Public Land

Grant Award:\$300,000
Matching Funds: \$4,600,500
Total Amount:\$4,900,500
Acquire the 2,745-acre Rolston Rest property, the largest
unprotected inholding within Vermont's Green Mountain
National Forest. Project will safeguard habitat for black bear,
northern river otter, bobcat and Bicknell's thrush while
protecting drinking water sources for local communities
and increasing recreational access for hikers, cross-country
skiers, hunters and anglers.
